## Unit 1: THE BASIC SENTENCE

Every sentence has a subject and a verb.

## Subject and verb

works is <u>not a sentence</u> because we do not learn who or what works; there is a verb, but <u>no</u> <u>subject.</u>

John is not a sentence; there is no verb.

John works is <u>a sentence</u>; there is a subject (John) and a verb (works).

John, the paramedic is <u>not a sentence</u>; there is <u>no verb</u>. We do not learn how John and the paramedic go together.

Here are some sentences:

SUBJECT	VERB	
John	is	a paramedic.
John	works	with paramedics.
John	is talking	to a paramedic.
The new hospital	is	the busiest in the city.
The medical clinic on 5 <sup>th</sup> Avenue	is	very old.

## Word order

If a sentence tells us something (a statement), the verb goes after the subject. If a sentence asks us something (a question), one word of the verb goes before the subject.

	VERB	SUBJECT	VERB	
STATEMENT		John	is feeling	sick.
QUESTION	Is	John	feeling	sick?
