## **Unit 47: MASS NOUNS**

Mass nouns do not have a singular or plural form (Unit 45). We cannot say *a water* or *three waters*; we just say **water**.

## 2 How to count mass nouns

**a** For many mass nouns (except liquids), we can use **bit:** 

a **bit** of advice a little **bit** of salt

two **bits** of cheese

**b** For many mass nouns (except liquids and some abstracts), we can use **piece** 

a **piece** of bread two **pieces** of information

**c** For liquids and some food, we can use containers:

a **jar** of honey three **cups** of coffee

a **bottle** of water

**d** For liquids, food and material, we can use measuring words:

ten litres of gas

fifty **grams** of sugar

It is correct to say two coffees, please in a café because we understand two cups of coffee. **NOTICE:**
