## Unit 62: SIMPLE SENTENCE TYPES

All sentences need a subject and a verb. Some sentences do not need anything else to complete them. But with most sentences, a subject and a verb are not enough. This unit shows you seven basic types of sentences.

### 1

SUBJECT	+	VERB (only)
Maria		is working.
They		worked.
It		has been working.

Of course, we can add extra information if we want to:

#### Maria is working very hard these days.

#### They talked about work.

It has been working for days.

But the extra information is not necessary to make a good sentence.

### 2

SUBJECT	+	VERB	+	NOUN PHRASE (Unit 45)
We		have found		a broken fuse.
John		is		the best electrician.
The client		saw		me.

These sentences are not complete without the noun phrase.

# 3

SUBJECT	+	VERB	+	ADJECTIVE (Unit 64)
The noise		was		terrible.
She		looked		scared.
The fuse		popped		noisily.

You can also make sentences of this type with these verbs:

become, get, feel, seem, smell, sound.

#### 4

SUBJECT	+	VERB	+	NOUN PHRASE	+	PLACE
John		put		the fuse		in the fusebox.
He		left		his bag		on the van.

We must complete a sentence with **put** this way.

# 5

SUBJECT -	+ VERB +	NOUN PHRASE +	NOUN PHRASE	
She	gave	John	a screwdriver.	gave a screwdriver to John
John	finished	his	job.	finished it <b>for</b> himself
They	showed	us	the new fusebox.	showed the fusebox to us
He	told	me	a story.	told a story <b>to</b> me
Ι	paid	him	a hundred dollars.	paid my money <b>to</b> him

You can also make sentences of this type with these verbs:

ask, bring, find, leave, make, offer, owe, pay, promise, read, sell, send, take, teach, wish.

SUBJECT	+	VERB	+	NOUN PHRASE	+	ADJECTIVE
Ι		twisted		the wire		tightly.
They		kept		the lights		bright.
She		painted		the fusebox		black.

You can also make sentences of this type with these verbs:

call, find, get, hate, have, leave, like, prefer, want.

# 7

SUBJECT	+	VERB	+	to	+	BASE FORM OF VERB (Unit 14)
Everybody		had		to		go.
Ι		want		to		leave.

#### NOTICE

The sentences in **1-7** above show the basic information in the sentence. But we can always add extra information to them. For example:

2	above	We have found a broken fuse in the fusebox.
3	above	Yesterday, the noise was terrible.
4	above	He left his bag in the van <b>by mistake</b> .
5	above	She gave John a screwdriver for his birthday.
6	above	They kept the lights bright while working.
7	above	I want to leave as soon as possible.
