## Unit 70: COMPARING THREE OR MORE

We can use both comparative and superlative forms (Unit 68).

SUPERLATIVE FORM	COMPARATIVE FORM + than
That was <b>the best</b> time I've ever made.	I've never made <b>better</b> time <b>than</b> that.
The drive home is <b>the longest</b> trip of the day. =	The drive home is <b>longer than</b> any other trip of the day.
Nobody here gets much money but John = gets <b>the least.</b>	Nobody gets much money but John gets <b>less than</b> anybody else.
Everybody drove fast but Shanda drove <b>the</b> = <b>fastest.</b>	Everybody drove fast but Shanda drove <b>faster than</b> anybody else.
Delivering flowers is the <b>most rewarding</b> = delivery I make.	I cannot imagine anything <b>more rewarding than</b> delivering flowers.
What's the <b>most frightening thing</b> that's ever happened to you?	It is difficult to make a comparative question when we are comparing more than two.
Could you tell me the way to <b>the nearest</b> supermarket?	
A big semi truck is <b>the least fuel efficient</b> = vehicle.	A big semi truck is <b>less fuel efficient then</b> any other vehicle.

Everybody gets a bonus this year, but Jonah's is

larger than the others.

To make the superlative stronger (if there is a big difference), we can use by far:

That was **by far** the best film I've ever seen. = much better than any others

**NOTICE:** In the crew, Jonah gets the most money.

Everybody get a bonus this year, but Jonah =

gets the largest.

Of the eleven employees, Jonah gets the most money.
